## Learning Objectives

- Review the medical and surgical principles in treating the infected foot with soft tissue and/or bone involvement including antibiotic selection, surgical debridement, and reconstruction

- Review the medical and surgical decision making principles in the management of the neuropathic foot including bracing, reconstruction, and medication selection
- In separate sessions, provide instructions by experienced OR nurses and radiologic technologists on preparation and implementation of complex vascular procedures
- Review the current state-of-the-art on management of AV access and its complications
- Review current concepts on treatment of venous disease, including non-thermal ablation of saphenous veins
- Provide advice on setting up an outpatient facility by those who have done it

## General/Vascular Sessions

Discuss the latest technologies, techniques and clinical data for surgical and endovascular repair of aortic aneurysms and carotid disease as well as management options for vascular disease. Important updates and new significant advances will be presented along with interesting video case presentations.

## Wound Care and Podiatry Sessions

Identify the newest developments in wound care, including wound healing products, local surgical flaps and grafts and discuss complex wound controversies as well as advances in podiatric therapies.

## Radiologic Technologist Sessions

Outline best practices and techniques for optimal OR preparation and implementation of complex vascular procedures from experienced Radiologic Technologists.

## OR Nurse Sessions

Review essential OR equipment and preparation strategies for arterial access and closure techniques as well as discuss wires, catheters, balloons and stents.

## Visiting Nurse Sessions

This session will discuss the do's and don'ts of chronic wound management in terms of what to use and what to avoid for the visiting nurse. Didactic sessions along with hand-on sessions addressing compression therapy, dressings, topical agents, off-loading footwear, total contact castings, and arterial and venous assessment will be covered.

## AV Access Sessions

This program will feature a thorough discussion of the options regarding the creation of AV access using autologous vein as well as the new ready access synthetic grafts. It will also include a comprehensive discussion regarding the management of existing complex AV access grafts and fistulas and new options that are available. Individuals involved in the creation and long-term maintenance of hemodialysis access will find this course very informative and helpful.

## Fellows Course

Identify how to build a practice, including how to choose a practice, how to negotiate a contract, and discussion of outpatient procedures. In-depth venous presentations and arterial cases will be showcased as well as multidisciplinary case discussions.

## Veins, Arteries and Wounds: A Multidisciplinary Evaluation Don't Just Sit There

Live cases will be presented including real time ultrasound Duplex imaging of patients – venous and arterial. Attendees and an expert faculty panel will discuss case management in an interactive forum. No PowerPoint presentations, just real live discussion about real live patients.

Disease states to be addressed will include: superficial venous disease, chronic deep venous disease, non-healing wounds (venous and arterial), mixed arterial and venous disease, and complex arterial disease.
