General/Vascular Sessions

Discuss the latest technologies, techniques and clinical data for surgical and endovascular repair of aortic aneurysms and carotid disease as well as management options for vascular disease. Important updates and new significant advances will be presented along with interesting video case presentations.

Wound Care and Podiatry Sessions

Identify the newest developments in wound care, including wound healing products, local surgical flaps and grafts and discuss complex wound controversies as well as advances in podiatric therapies.

Radiologic Technologist Sessions

It will also include a comprehensive discussion regarding the management of existing complex AV access grafts and fistulas and new options that are available. Individuals involved in the creation and long-term maintenance of hemodialysis access will find this course very informative and helpful.

Fellows Course

Identify how to build a practice, including how to choose a practice, how to negotiate a contract, and discussion of outpatient procedures. In-depth venous presentations and arterial cases will be showcased as well as multidisciplinary case discussions.

Live cases will be presented including real time ultrasound Duplex imaging of patients – venous and arterial. Attendees and an expert faculty panel will discuss case management in an interactive forum. No PowerPoint presentations, just real live discussion about real live patients.
